



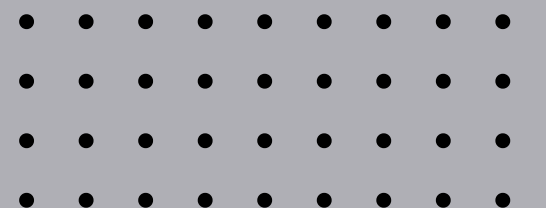

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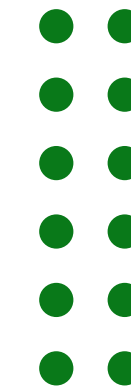


Executive Summary

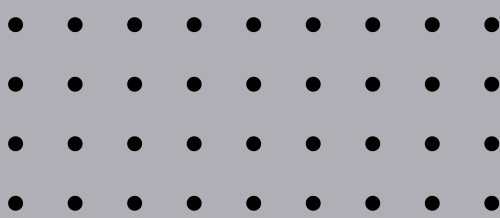
Woodsboro ISD is committed to equipping our students with the tools to navigate an ever-changing world to accomplish their post-secondary dreams while honoring the rich traditions and core values that have historically defined our district. The school board remains focused on improving student outcomes by celebrating successes while also shining a light and allocating resources to areas of need.

Through grants like Strong Foundations and Jobs & Education for Texans (JET), the district has secured aligned High-Quality Instructional Materials with frameworks for stakeholders to commit to providing equitable instruction to all student populations, along with state-of-the-art technology that offers real-world experiences for our Career and Technology students.

Woodsboro ISD offers nine different sports, FFA, six Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathways, as well as opportunities for student leadership and service through NHS, NJHS, and Student Council. The district was also approved for a Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH) planning year, with the goal of opening a P-TECH academy in 2027. Woodsboro Elementary School opened the doors to its new facility in November and began serving students in a K–5 STEM-focused environment.

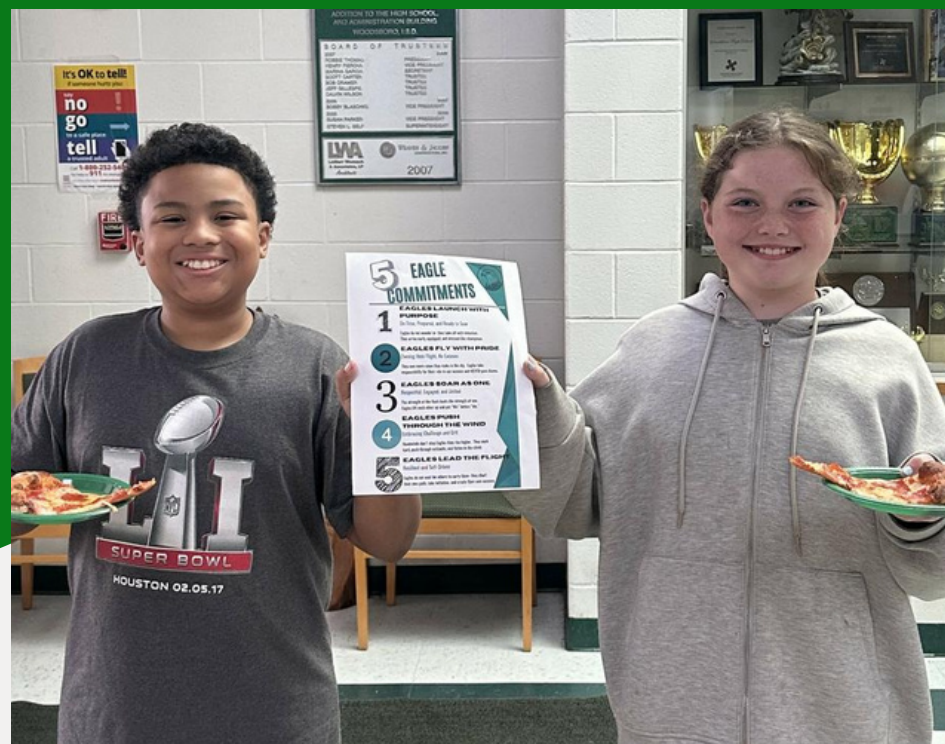
